Thank you so much for partnering with CPR-3 Breathe Partners in “Breathing Life and Hope into the world.” We could not be more honored that you have chosen to do that with us. We value your heart and passion to be the hands and feet of Christ by giving your time to come and experience Haiti. This year we are focusing on the SOIL in 4 steps:

Step 1: Understanding the SOIL

(Understanding the Haitian SOIL / Understanding the Urban SOIL)

We seek to understand rather than be understood. In step 1 we provide 3 things:

- Relationship with Haitian communities

Unified Exposure

- Haitian culture
- Mission of Jesus (The Church)

Understanding Edaphology (The Study of Soils)

- Spiritual

Step 2: Preparing the SOIL

We seek to be patient and wait on God’s timing and location to plant where seed can flourish; We will work hard in the flesh and rely harder on the Spirit of God

Saturate the community with presence

Organize systems and structures for optimal growth

Integrate the seed (Jesus) into the culture and community

Love and care for the people in the community unconditionally

Breathing Life and Hope into the World by reaching the:

Young – NOW Generation

Lost – People Searching for God

Poor – Caring for the Physical and Spiritual Needs of People

1. Material
2. Relational
3. Spiritual

NECESSARY ELEMENTS FOR SOIL PREPARATION:

- Prayer: Pray first, last, in between and hard.
- Personal transformation precedes community transformation
- The best strategy for reaching lost people is to show up – Presence Matters!
- We need to learn to start sitting in the smoking section and in the dark places – In it...not Of it
- Bad people make good soil. They have lots of crap in their lives. We will welcome ‘bad’ people into our church doors

Step 3: Planting the Seed in the SOIL

We seek to deepen relationships and look for the places where Jesus is taking root

Where is the WIND Blowing? We cannot control the direction or the timing of God's breath, but we can hoist the sails and align with his movement by investing in prayer and giving.

This is what God the Lord says—the Creator of the heavens, who stretches them out, who spreads out the earth with all that springs from it, who gives breath to its people, and life to those who walk on it. Isaiah 42:5

We need to feel the BREATH of:

OF GOD'S POWER

- His Power Is Unleashed by Prayer – He can and wants to do extraordinary things
- What does it mean for God to unleash His power on us? We are talking about souls being added to the Kingdom daily. The church multiplied!

OF GOD'S PLAN

- According to the power that is in the Church. - The corporate Church.
- 1881 Acts 1:8 and Acts 8:1 A local and global strategy where believers are being scattered - The Individual that makes up the Church....'one's sent'

OF GOD'S PURPOSE

- To glorify Himself through the church and Christ Jesus
- Church 168 - Not 1 day / 24 Hours a week, but every hour of the week. 168 Hours

Step 4: Watering the Seed and Caring for its Environment

- Encouragement and empowerment

- Deposit is non-refundable but it is transferable with in the same calendar year.
- Your Experience date will not be secure until you return the MOU and submit deposit.

- CPR-3 desires to provide the best experience possible. In order for that to happen we will reserve the same week date for the first two teams who complete their MOU and include their Deposit fee. We will do our best to accommodate all requests but preference will be reserved for the first two teams.

* **IMPORTANT:** Haiti has now issued a \$10 Airport Tax that is paid upon entry into the country. Each participant MUST bring a \$10 bill.

Special Notes:

- Students receive a \$50 discount starting January 1, 2017
- 1 Leader OR 1 Pastor (if team is 10 or greater) can come for \$350
- Guest House Pricing is \$70 (includes light breakfast and dinner) – no transportation
- Extra nights for team members are \$100 per day/night
- Breathe Staff and Family - Daily Cost: \$50 (plus transportation and programming on you if not with team)

Your experience includes lodging (6 nights at the Sant Mouvman), 6 breakfasts at the Sant Mouvman, 6 dinners at the Sant Mouvman, transportation, culligan water (Unlimited), logistics, interpreters (unless extra are required), security, beach day and general ministry. CPR-3 understands that each church/group may have specific goals and or projects, those prices are listed in the next section.

Experience Team Extras:

- Teams that are less than 5 participants: an extra \$250 transportation fee for the week
- Interpreters: Cost includes 1 interpreter for 1-7 participants. 2 interpreters for 8-14 participants. 3 Interpreters for 15-21 participants. 4 interpreters for 22-28 participants. Interpreter/participant ratio is on the numerical value of 7 any increment there of is what a team is entitled to. IF there is a project where the church/group desires more, the cost will be \$25 per interpreter/per day.
- If you are a medical Team you are required to have a Haitian Doctor and Nurse with you at clinics. \$100 per day for Haitian Doctor, \$50 per day for Haitian Nurse. If medicine is required you can purchase in country (prescription meds cost \$100 per day per 100 patients) or pack appropriate meds in your luggage.
- Iron Market in Port Au Prince Trip: \$150 Transportation
- Sodo Water Fall Trip: \$150 Transportation
- Petionville / Munchies Pizza Restaurant: \$150 for Transportation plus the cost of the meals and tip
- Fruit Feast Night: \$3 per person (Depends on season and availability in country.)
- Ice Cream Night: \$2.50 per person (Depends on availability in country.)
- Refrigerated Drinks at the Sant Mouvman: \$1 per beverage

* **IMPORTANT:** Experience Team Extras: Fees that CPR-3 processes includes Transportation, Interpreters, and Medical Personnel Fees. Fees that the team will bring with them include restaurant costs, Fruit Feast, Ice Cream, Refrigerated Beverages.

IMPORTANT: Refund/Cancelation Policy

- *The \$1500 team deposit is non-refundable.*
- *If a team member decides to cancel the \$150 deposit per individual is non-refundable at any point.*
- *If there are any cancelations before the 45 days out from the experience date we will do our best to work with you to make a refund or reschedule your experience.*
- *If there are any cancelations after the 45 days out from the experience date all fees are non-refundable.*

By law and our Best Practice Partner ECFA policy: Contributions are solicited with the understanding that CPR-3 has complete discretion and control over the use of all donated funds. CPR-3 will attempt to honor gift preferences to support particular workers, but the final decision on the use of all funds rests with the organization.

When designated donations are received at the CPR-3 office we are obligated to follow established governing rules. If there is an overage and more was raised than needed it will be directed to the general mission. If there is a cancelation funds will be directed to the general mission. CPR-3 must follow the Best Practice Guidelines established for 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organizations. We are not authorized to submit personal checks back to individuals for mission experience. Please know that we will make sure all designated monies will be used to mission purpose.

You can expect to receive an MOU for each Experience Trip. This MOU will help us better understand the goals and commitments that are mutually shared. After we receive the MOU back from you we will review it in the office and our staff on the ground will review it as we start your itinerary for your experience. We will also send you a final invoice you for your Haiti Trip Experience expense.
